Mission Statement

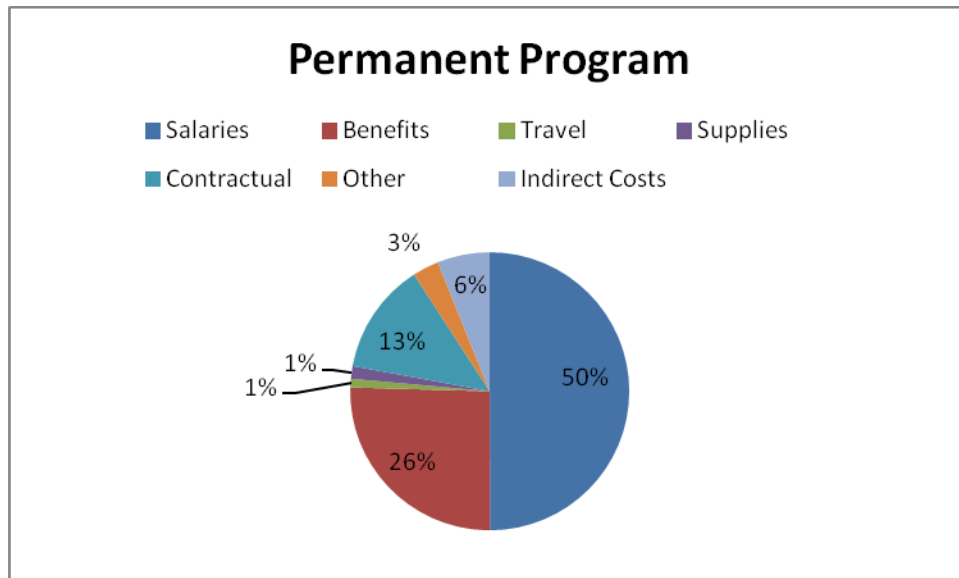
Siskiyou Early Head Start supports Siskiyou County children and families in building strong and healthy relationships. In partnership, we provide educational resources on health, nutrition, early childhood development, prenatal health, and child advocacy. Services are provided, throughout most of Siskiyou County, to pregnant women and children under age three. During the 2009-2010 program year a total of 123 families were served including 142 children and 35 pregnant women.

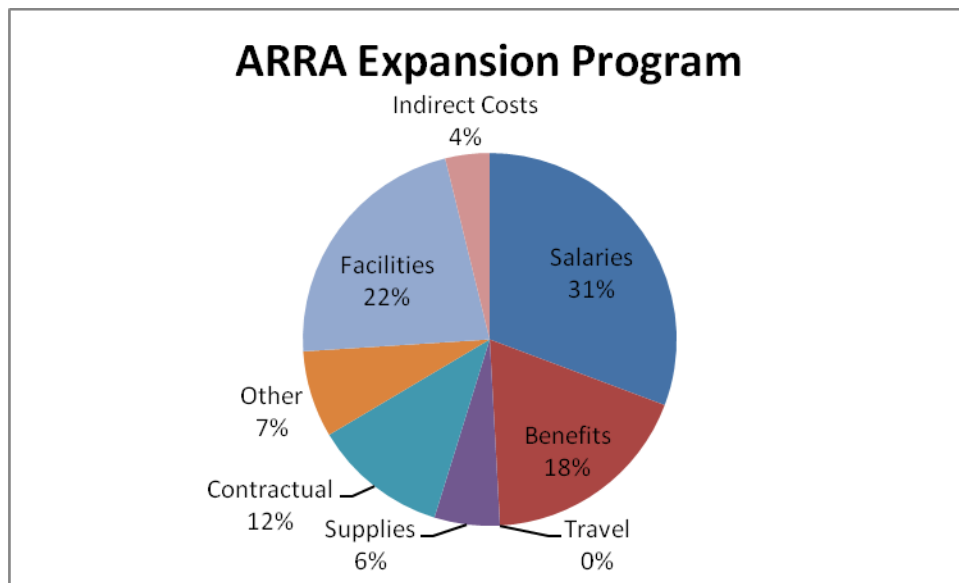

Monitoring Review

Siskiyou Early Head Start received a Federal Monitoring Review in January of 2008. SEHS was found to be in full compliance with all Head Start Performance Standards, regulations and policy requirements.

Financial Audit

Siskiyou County Office of Education received an audit in June of 2010 and there were no findings.

Percentage of enrolled children that received medical and dental exams

- 100% of enrolled children received a medical exam during the program year.
- 100% of enrolled children received a dental screening as part of their medical exam during the program year. All children are referred for a dental exam at the age of three.

SEHS estimates 60% of the eligible children in Siskiyou County received services.

Parent Involvement Activities

Parents are encouraged to:

- Participate in a goal setting process resulting in a family partnership agreement.
- Volunteer their time in the classrooms, at group socials, and parent committee activities.
- Participate in Policy Council which allows them to partake in the shared governance of the Siskiyou Early Head Start Program.

School Readiness

All enrolled children receive regular developmental screenings which are used to create individualized services. Individualized lesson plans and activities are designed to improve each child's skills.
