

## **Bailey Hill School District**

The Bailey Hill School District was formed in 1887. The name was changed from Bailey Hill to Hilt in 1921.

The first school house was located approximately two miles southwest of the present school at the junction of Soda Springs Road and Cottonwood Creek.

The earliest records that can be found on this school show that in 1890 a Mr. Edward Nolon was the teacher. He received a salary of \$65.00 per month. The school had eleven pupils.

By 1898 the enrollment had grown to 36 pupils and Sarah E. Williams was the teacher. The school directory of 1901 listed D.W. Whippler as the teacher and Wm. Lyttleton as the district clerk.

By 1920 the attendance had increased to the point that two teachers, Mary S. York and Mrs. Mable Stonehouse, were employed.

In July, 1921 the name of the school was changed from Bailey hill to Hilt.
