

Cleveland School District

The Cleveland School District was established in 1893. The school house was located 10.4 miles up the Copco Road from the junction (Ager) of the Montague-Klamath River Road and the Copco Road. The school house was located on a flat on the left-hand side of the road. No remains of the building can be found.

The earliest records in the County Superintendent of Schools office show that from July to September, Miss Blanch Whiting was the teacher. There were five teachers during the 1899-1900 school year. Each teacher taught a two or three month span. The salary was \$60 per month and there were twelve students that year.

In 1911, the Cleveland District was lapsed and the territory added to the Bogus School District.
