<p>Distance learning in place for all students</p> <p>Daily online interaction with teacher and peers</p>	<p>Distance learning in place for all students</p> <p>Student learning hubs operate at each site that are scalable depending on student needs, family interest, and staff availability</p> <p>Daily online interaction with teacher and peers. In-person instruction possibly available through on-site student learning hubs. Priority is given to students with special needs, English learners, Title I students, and students struggling with distance learning</p> <p>Face coverings worn at all times on campus</p> <p>No extra adults on campus</p>	<p>Distance learning in place for families still not comfortable with face-to-face learning</p> <p>In-person hybrid model: half of students learn on campus and half through distance learning each four days a week. The fifth day is reserved for distance learning, teacher collaboration, planning, and for student learning hub participation</p> <p>Daily online or in-person interaction with teacher and peers</p> <p>Student groups remain isolated at all times</p> <p>Face coverings worn at all times on campus except during nap time for kindergarteners and while eating, snacking, or during outdoor recreation</p> <p>No extra adults on campus except for parent volunteers</p>	<p>Back to normal--all students and all teachers back in the classroom</p> <p>Face coverings are still an option for students and teachers wishing to wear them</p>

<p>Siskiyou County is not on California's COVID-19 monitoring list for 14 consecutive days</p> <p>Periodic COVID-19 testing plan in place for staff members who will participate in any level of in-person instruction</p> <p>Face coverings ready to be made available to all students and adults on campus</p> <p>On-site staff members self-screen daily for fever of 100.4 or higher and other symptoms of COVID-19</p> <p>Students on-site checked for fever of 100.4 or higher using no-touch thermometers.</p> <p>School community encouraged to social distance, wash hands, and use face coverings while in public</p> <p>COVID-19 student transportation plan in place</p>	<p>The following are the minimum conditions that must be met; the board and the administration will collaborate with local public health officials in moving to the next steps.</p> <p>No new cases in the student learning hubs (children or adults and immediate household) for 14 consecutive days</p> <p>Maximized ventilation/filtration systems in place in both schools, including portable high-efficiency air cleaners for rooms without adequate ventilation</p> <p>Handwashing stations and hand sanitizer available on both campuses</p> <p>Additional face coverings ready to be made available to all students and adults on campus</p> <p>Families self-screen students and family members daily for fever of 100.4 or higher and other symptoms of COVID-19</p>	<p>No new cases in Siskiyou County for 30 consecutive days</p>	<p>No students or staff members become infected with COVID-19 and/or a COVID-19 vaccine is widely available</p>
