

## Cedar Park School District

The Cedar Park District was formed from part of the Mount Shasta District and established in 1869. The first school was located on the banks of the Shasta River near the point where it flows into Lake Shastina. No remains of the school can be found.

The second school was located on what is now the Mills Ranch. (From the junction of Interstate 5 and the airport interchanges, travel six miles east to the junction of the Airport Road and Slough Road, then one mile north on Slough Road.) Part of the old school house now forms the living room of the Mills' family ranch house.

Mr. M. F. Cowan was the teacher during the 1899-1900 school year. His salary was \$80.00 per month. Twenty-four pupils attended school that year. Although we have no school directory for the 1934-35 school year, it is believed that Mrs. Marion Hartley, who taught in the 1933-34 school year, was the last teacher of the Cedar Park School.

In 1935 the Cedar Park District was unionized with the Edgewood district to form the Butteville Union School District.
