

Junction School District

The Junction School District was established in 1892. The present school is located approximately two miles north of the community of Somes Bar on Klamath River Highway 96.

There have been several school houses built and abandoned over the years, all of which were located in the same vicinity. In 1899 Mrs. Anna H. Haskell was the teacher. School was held for seven months with 20 pupils in attendance that year.
