

## **Klamath School District**

There is no record as to the exact date this district was established (sometime prior to 1881). The school house was located at the settlement of Oak Bar, approximately 4.5 miles west on the South Side Road from the Walker Bridge. The site was on what is now the Summer Estate (Oak Bar) of the Crocker Bank Corporation.

During the 1899-1900 school year, there were two teachers employed. Miss Kate Timmons taught 2.5 months, and then a Miss E.A. Neilon taught the remainder of the year. School was held for 6.5 months with 17 pupils in attendance. The district was lapsed in 1928 and the territory annexed to the Hilt, Riverside, and Horse Creek School Districts.
