

Lone Star School District

The Lone Star District was formed in 1896. The school house is located on the Scott River Road approximately three and half miles from Fort Jones and it is still standing. Mrs. Mary A. Davidson was the teacher in 1899. School was held for seven months with 19 pupils in attendance. The district was lapsed and annexed to the Lincoln District in 1943.
