

McConaughy School District

This district was established in 1885 and was active until 1947 when it was lapsed and annexed to Etna. Miss L. Millie Burns was the teacher in 1900. School was held for eight months with 32 pupils attending.

The school house was located approximately a half mile south of the junction of the McConaughy Gulch Road and the East Side Fort Jones-Callahan Road. The last school building is now part of a residence.
