

Meamber School District

The Meamber District was founded in 1870. The school house still stands on the original site seven miles from Fort Jones on the Scott River Road at its junction with the Quartz Valley Road.

In 1899, Mr. Walter Reed was the teacher. School was half seven and a half months with 35 pupils. The district was lapsed and annexed to Fort Jones in 1957.

Reference in board of Supervisors minutes:

Established: May 3, 1870 – No boundaries given (3-90)

July 8, 1902 – Part of Scott River Canyon School District attached to Meamber (7-21)

April 3, 1905 – Part of Meamber School District given to Scott River School District (7-170)

February 4, 1911 – Petition to form a new school district from parts of Meamber and Quartz Valley rejected (8-391)

August 3, 1937 – The Mill Creek School District was lapsed and part of territory given to Meamber School District (18-37)

September 7, 1938 – Description of boundaries given to Meamber (18-55)

July 6, 1951 – District suspended (20-482)

August 7, 1957 – District lapsed and re-established (21-500)

July 9, 1957 – Annexed to Fort Jones Union (24-144)
