

## **Mono School District**

The Mono District was established in 1911. The school house was located on a knoll nears the forks of Humbug Creek, just west of the road. The site is approximately nine miles west on the Hawkinsville-Humbug Road from its junction with old Highway 99. No remains of the school house can be found.

The earliest record of this school in the County Office show that in 1911, Mrs. Hattie B. Lester was the teacher and school was held for eight months. The district was lapsed in 1958 and annexed to Yreka.
