

Oberlin School District

The Oberlin District was established in 1891. It was lapsed in 1899, after a life span of eight years. The territory was attached to the Montague School District.

We can find no record of where the school house was located. However, from the boundary description of the district recorded in the minutes of the County Board of Supervisors, it is likely that the building was located in the vicinity of the present Delphic School house. The boundaries of the Oberlin District and the boundaries of the Delphic District are about the same. It is probable that when Delphic District was formed in 1919, approximately the same boundaries were used and only the name was changed from Oberlin to Delphic.

The first teacher was Mary Bantz. School was held for six months with 16 pupils in attendance.
