

Pinery School District

The Pinery District was established in 1893. The school house was located approximately three miles up Kidder Creek on the South Kidder Creek Road. It was named “pinery” after a big gold mine that was located nearby.

No trace of the school house remains. There is no record as to what happened to the district, but it was probably taken over by the Greenview District.

In 1899, Mr. Leonard S. Evans was the teacher. School was held for six months with an enrollment of 20 pupils.
