

Riverside School District

The Riverside District was established in 1888. The school house was located one mile west of the Walker Bridge on the South Side Road. There are no remains of the school building.

The Riverside District was unionized with the Rocky Mountain District in 1951. Also, in 1951, both of these districts were included in the newly formed Klamath River Union School District. Mrs. Ellen F. Hicks was the teacher in 1899. School was held for a seven month term with 14 pupils attending.
