

Rocky Mountain School District

The Rocky Mountain School District was established in 1897. The school house was located one and a half miles east of the Walker Bridge on the South Side Road between Barkhouse Creek and Little Humbug Creek. The building is still standing.

Mr. Henry N. White was the first teacher of this school. Classes were held for an eight month term with 17 pupils attending.

Established: January 4, 1897 – Boundaries described (6-23)

April 5, 1902 – Boundary change (6-637)

February 5, 1917 – Beaver Creek School District formed out of part of Rocky mountain District (11-41)

February 7, 1922 – Part of Beaver Creek District annexed By Rocky Mountain (12-398)

February 7, 1922 – Boundaries re-defined (12-399)

August 4, 1931 – District lapsed (20-151)

November 14, 1946 – Above order of lapsation, wording changed (20-188)

February 6, 1951 – Unionized with Riverside (21-383)
