

Shasta View School District

The Shasta View School District was established in 1916. The school house was located on the Big Springs Road; six miles south of the junction of the Big Springs Road and A-12. The school stood a few yards from the face of Lake Shastina Dam. The building was sold and removed from the site.

Two teachers taught the first year, Lois Tuttle and Blossom E. White, teaching teaching for four months. The district lapsed in 1955 and attached to the Big Springs District.

July 19, 1950 – Shasta View (that part of Big Springs Union) suspended (21-248)

September 5, 1950 – Re-established (21-279)

August 4, 1953 – Suspended (22-496)

July 12, 1955 – Shasta View part of Big Springs District lapsed (24-8)

August 16, 1955 – Letter of lapsing (24-32)
