

Sheep Mountain School District

The district was established in 1908 and was located approximately 12 miles northeast of Macdoel on the Surprise Valley road. The school was on the north edge of Surprise Valley, about three miles east of the Shady Dell Road. The school accommodated the families of the farmers and loggers of the area. No trace of the building remains.

Two teachers served this school the first year. Miss Sadie Rainey taught for the first two months and then Mrs. Lena B. Freemeyer taught a month until Miss Rainey returned. There were seven pupils.

February 7, 1922 – Boundary change (12-400)

August 2, 1927 – Lapsed and territory annexed to Red Rock District (14-249)
