

Shelvin Rock School District

The district was established in 1898. The site of the school house was approximately four miles north of Hornbrook on the west side of Interstate 5, halfway between Hilt and Hornbrook. No trace remains of the building.

The first teacher was Miss Lena Marshal. School was held for seven and a half months with 21 pupils attending. The district was suspended in 1937. No record is available as to what happened to the district. It was probably divided between Hilt and Hornbrook.
