

Table Rock School District

The Table Rock School District was established in 1869. The school was located one and a half miles northeast on the Davis Road from its junction with Harry Cash Road. Several schools were built on this site over the years. The last building is still standing and is now being used as a residence.

In 1899, Mr. M.H. Madden was the teacher. School was held for seven and a half months with 14 pupils attending. The district was lapsed in 1940 and the territory was annexed to Little Shasta School District.

Established: August 2, 1869 – Established by dividing the Little Shasta School District, no boundaries given (3-48)

May 2, 1870 – Above said establishment voided (3-89)

Re-Established: August 2, 1870 – Boundaries described (3-96)

August 4, 1873 – Boundary change (3-218)

January 7, 1887 – Boundary change (4-192)

April 4, 1898 – Boundary change (6-188)

April 5, 1902 – Boundary change (6-638)

January 3, 1911 – New school district to be known as Big Springs School District created from territory now included in the Table Rock District (8-375)

February 2, 1914 – Boundary change (9-420)

August 4, 1919 – Suspended (12-43)

September 3, 1919 – Re-established (12-57)

August 5, 1924 – Suspended (13-266)

September 3, 1924 – Re-established (13-279)

January 6, 1931 – Boundary change (16-19)

July 2, 1940 – Lapsed, territory included in Little Shasta District (18-336)
