

Washington School District

It is not known just when this district was established. The minutes of the Board of supervisors show a boundary change for the district in 1859.

The school house was located between Greenview and Etna, just north of the Patterson Creek Bridge between the present highway and the old settlement of Cheeseville. No traces of the school house remain.

In 1899, the teacher was Miss Grace Johnson (the author's mother). School was held for seven months with 33 pupils attending. The district lapsed and was annexed to Etna in 1922.
